Gaslighting is a form of psychological abuse in which the abuser creates self-doubt and confusion in the victim until they cannot trust themselves to know what is true. An abuser will also try to isolate their victim from family and friends. Chapters 2–5 are the hardest for readers. It's hard to see someone fall under another person's control. Spotting these signs can help you save yourself and others.

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1.In chapter 2, lan is making Malaya feel better after a fight with her mom. When she asks how he always knows how to make her feel better, he says, "Because I'm there for you when no one else is," (pg 19.) Why is this a sign of gaslighting?

(From the description of gaslighting) An abuser will isolate a victim from their family and friends. While saying, "Because I'm there for you when no one else is," may sound romantic, it is a tool to create distrust between the victim and their support system (family and friends.) A healthy partner will want you to be able to turn to your family and friends when you need help.

2. In chapter 3, there are three significant moments of abuse. Give one example with textual evidence, and explain why the behavior is abusive.

A. lan manipulates Malaya's memory by trying to get her to believe he did invite her to the party. ""I told you about the party. Remember, you were doing homework when I called to invite you?" (pg 31). This causes her to question herself, which is how abusers gain control. It also makes her feel guilty for something she didn't do.

B. lan gets frustrated with Malaya for not forgiving him and yells at her, evoking fear. "For the thousandth time, it happened once," he says, clearly talking about the cheating incident. (Pg. 33)

C. Ian uses affection to try to get Malaya to ignore a serious issue between them. "He kisses me like he's trying to erase any memories of the camera." (Pg 35).



3. In Chapter 4, how does lan exclude Malaya from his life? Why can we assume that Malaya's theory of the exclusion is correct? Use inferencing and textual evidence to explain.

lan has all of his friends block Malaya so she can't see what's going on at the party. We can infer this is true because there are no party-related posts from "friends" she normally sees posting. Knowing that lan loves attention, it is uncharacteristic of him not to have several posts of his party. "Why do I have to see every breakfast they have and joint they roll, but this party is somehow not eventful enough to document?" (pg 39).

4. In Chapter 5, lan's mental and emotional abuse turns physical. Using events from any previous chapter, explain why Malaya doesn't drive home or call friends for help.

Students might reference any moments in which lan manipulated Malaya to cut ties with family or friends. There are several fights with Mom. There is also the way he mentions her best friend Stephanie knowing about their situation, and not thinking it's a big deal. At this point she's so embarrassed and so entrenched in the abuse she doesn't even reach out to Stephanie to see if this is true.

splashes. I grip the top of the tailgate and pull myself up as quietly as I can, but it creaks. I freeze.

Without moving any other muscles, I glance at the Tikbalang.

He, too, is frozen. Only his ears flicker as he listens for the source of the sound. Then his head snaps in my direction as he takes in my entire, exposed presence.

Too late to hide, I launch myself into the truck bed. I shake my shoulders violently as I try to get the backpack off my back. Panic seems to speed up time while simultaneously slowing down all my actions. When the bag hits the ground, I turn on my knee and rip the zipper open. The *Tikbalang* gallops toward me, his hindlegs *clop clopping* against the asphalt while his two gnarled human hands pad the ground.

I reach for the rope and yank to get it out of the small bag opening, but it catches once before I get it free. The monster is so close that its long shadow nearly touches me, so I don't have time to unravel this rope to get it around the *Tikbalang's* neck.

As the werehorse runs full force into the truck, I clumsily grab the edge of the bed and hold on tight with all my might. Sweaty palms and a hand full of rope causes my right hand to slip. My chest slams against the metal bed, sending a shooting pain throughout my torso. Luckily, the *Tikbalang* backs up, dropping the truck to the ground.

I jump to my feet and launch myself at his neck as his arms swipe the air to grab me. His horsey frontal vision must not be great because he misses. I hit his side with all my body weight, causing him to grunt. One foot digs into his mid-back, and I clench my muscles as I try to mount him. The *Tikbalang* swings around, banging me into the side of the truck.

Pain bursts through my leg and up my back, but it's not as bad as it could have been if he could see me properly. I loop the rope around the *Tikbalang's* neck and yank myself into a seated position on his back just in time to see Salvador standing in the street, flashing his light at the *Tikbalang* and howling like a wolf.

Run! I point in the opposite direction.

Salvador shouts, "No!" But the *Tikbalang's* thunderously deep neigh covers most of it. The beast huffs, and his sticky breath whips around toward me as he spins on the spot. Then he starts bucking.

Somewhere in the distance, Anita is screaming, but I can't make out a word.

We're spinning and bucking in circles so fast that the night, the street, the trees are a swirling palette of receding colors. Then the *Tikbalang* runs. He races up and down the road, trying to scrape me off on tree trunks and mailboxes. I shift my body weight, lifting my legs to avoid the objects when I can, but hot blood pours from my arms and legs as my skin is ripped open from the shrapnel.

I don't know how much longer I can last, but I grip the monster with my knees as tight as I can and remind myself that there won't be a do-over if I die. The muscles in my hands cramp from gripping the rope so tightly. Suddenly, the werehorse throws its head back and rears up on its hind legs. I lose my balance, and the world slows as the rope slips from my grasp.

I clutch the *Tikbalang's* spiny mane, and there's white-hot pain as he comes back down on all fours. Blood pours out of my left hand as I'm impaled through the palm. I cry out, but not even the strength of this pain is heard from my silenced throat.

Gabrielle shrieks from the yard nearest me, "Malaya, car," and points behind me. An engine roars, and I lift my legs in time to see the Mustang fly by, narrowly missing the *Tikbalang*—who slides sideways onto the asphalt to avoid

being hit—trapping my leg under his giant body. The crushing weight sends a stabbing sensation through me.

Salvador and Anita are flanking the beast, trying to distract it so I can get away, while Gabrielle is darting behind bushes, flashing her light at us, so who the hell is driving the car?

"Get out of there," Gabrielle shouts. "We'll try something else." Her fearful eyes connect with mine, and I point with my lips at my impaled palm—afraid to let go of the beast's mane with my other hand. Gabrielle races toward me and then runs back into the yard. I shake my head furiously so she stays away, but the *Tikbalang* starts to rise.

Gabrielle races full speed toward us.

Lifting one of its long humanoid arms, the *Tikbalang* swipes at Salvador, who knocks the werehorse's muscular arm out of the way like he's swatting at a fly. Salvador's face is triumphant for a split second before the *Tikbalang's* other arm swings at him, knocking him to the ground. His head hits the pavement, and he goes still.

No! With my free hand, I grip the spine trapping me to the werehorse and rip it out in one swift movement. Though the *Tikbalang* neighs demonically, it's not enough to distract him from Gabrielle's running war cry.

As she comes into the werehorse's reach, he swipes at her, nicking her face. She ducks to avoid his long, jabbing arm sliding against the gravel with only her jeans to protect her and grabs the rope. 

While this book is a fantasy, it is told through the lens of my own personal experiences with abuse as a teenager.

Students will have various answers that could work and that is up to your discretion. Not all abuse is the same and there are nuances in every situation.

For me, I want people to understand that there is a difference between knowing something in your head which wars with your feelings in your heart. I want people to see that this kind of abuse is about controlling victims by removing their autonomy and all ability to trust themselves. It isn't as simple as the stigma of, "if it were me, I would leave," no matter how much I wish it was.

When Malaya returns to her old world, she has all of the knowledge of what life could be like without lan, but her love for him is as strong and toxic as ever. It's an emotion she has to overcome and fight through, and one of the ways she does that is by relying on her family.
